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




Philosophy

Play Programme Aim:

The Tír Na Nóg groups achieve these objectives by utilising individually devised Play sessions which ensures that each child is given the means and opportunity to:

- Join in at the child's developmental level and build on his/her natural interests and there by improving their attention, engagement and communication skills.
- Open and closed circles of communications; improved child/parent interactions.
- Extend the circles of communications; improved family and peer interactions
- Children may also learn to manage relationships and improved relations with family and friends.
- Broaden the child's range of interactions and curiosity.
- ♣ For the staff / parents to tailor their interactions to the children's individual differences within each play group session and at home.
- ♣ Through sensory exploration and interactive experiences we help children to incorporate these experiences into reaching their developmental milestones.
